ANNUAL REVIEW REPORT FOR 2024

In traditional manner I shall start with the acceptance rate. In 2024 we received 38 articles, published 14 and declined 24 (36.8%), Since 2016 we have received 309 articles, published 163 and declined 146 (45%). The acceptance rate for 2024 is 63%, and over the whole period – 53%.

Judging by such keywords, as "sleeping", "selective mutism", "developing reading skills", "translation studies" and the like, some colleagues have never read our guidelines and have not thoroughly examined the scope of our journal. Some articles are declined not only because they are out of our scope, for example, we will never accept for consideration texts of offensive character which include vulgarisms. We strictly stick to our publication ethics and decline any article which violates the ethical principles of publication.

We have reduced the volume of our articles from 30 pages to 12-16. Notwithstanding this, some colleagues sent us articles of very small size (5-7 pages). In my opinion, it is hardly possible to make a serious analysis of the problem within such a volume of text, taking into account the cover page, references and contact data.

These are the main reasons for declining articles.

I was really upset when we discovered that RevolverMaps, which we have used since June 18 2016, stopped working. We received 42,627 visitors up until March 2024; by the end of the year, we would estimate considerably more. Our webmaster Michal Kubovics found another application, which we have used since December 17 2024. Though not much time has passed, the interest in our journal is vividly displayed in the new map, which shows that over the last two weeks we have received 281 visits. (see Fig. 1).




Figure 2. Map of visitors as of December 31 2024. Source: Lege artis site; own processing

The current map on our website shows visitors in a condensed form. Countries are more clearly seen in Fig. 2.




Figure 6. The list of our authors' locations in 2024. Source: Lege artis site; own processing




Figure 7. University of La Rioja, Logroño, Spain

Clicking on the arrow the author can see the list of universities (see Fig. 6) and choose the university to which they belong (see Fig. 7).

Clicking on the city will open a photograph of the university at which our authors work (see Fig. 7).




Figure 8. Publications and citations of *Lege artis* in Web of Science in December 2024. Source: Web of Science site




Figure 9. Publications and citations of *Lege artis* in Web of Science in December 2024. Source: Web of Science site

Lege artis is indexed in 25 databases. As of December 2024, our journal is represented in Web of Science in the following way (see Figs. 8 and 9).




Figure 11. Lege artis rank by Journal Citation Indicator. Source: Web of Science website

Web of Science now provides more information about each journal. For a long time, our journal was ranked Q1 (see Fig. 11). I hope we will soon regain this position.




Figure 12. Citations of Lege artis in other journals. Source: Web of Science website

Web of Science indicates the citation of *Lege artis* by other journals (see Fig. 12). Although these data are from 2023, they are currently the most recent and we use them for the first time.





Figure 13. The geography of Lege artis authors. Source: Web of Science website
